Internet Connection Requirements

A student must have a broadband or high-speed internet connection. Cable Modem, DSL or ADSL, or Satellite is acceptable. Dial-up connections will not permit the required data exchange! If you do not have high-speed internet, please make arrangements to order this service from your local provider. The minimum rates required are a1.0 Mbps upload speed and a 600kbps download. How to check Internet speed: Go to http://www.performance.toast.net to test "Upload Speed" and "Download Speed". The internet service provider's SLA (Service Level Agreement) is usually 70% of what you buy. At 256 Kbit you are promised 179 kbps. At 384 Kbit you are promised 268 kbps, etc.

D-I-S-C-L-A-I-M-E-R

A student's internet service provider (ISP) plays a key role in a student's ability to view archived streaming video successfully. How to check Internet speed: Go to (http://www.speedtest.net/) to test "Upload Speed" and "Download Speed." If the test results are unsatisfactory, you may need to notify your ISP, change your ISP, or upgrade equipment before re-testing. Amridge will help you interpret the test and suggest solutions.
